



A heartfelt thank you to all the students, teachers, and staff who have contributed to making these events and accomplishments possible. Your efforts truly inspire us all.



aimed to promote bullying prevention


and raise student awareness.

12th September 2024, the SIS Student Council conducted an Anti-Vaping Campaign aimed at raising awareness about the harmful effects of vaping and




Onam Celebration



All the standees prepared by the student participants were arranged in the Learning lounge and all other students visited the exhibition area. Student participants enthusiastically explained their working model to all the visitors.





Overall, the Indian University Fair was a resounding success, leaving participants inspired, informed, and better equipped to navigate their academic futures.



As the evening progressed, students took part in talent shows, fashion shows, and stand-up comedy performances, showcasing their creativity and confidence.







Hanana delivered the "Thought for the Day," sharing a meaningful message about kindness as a silent yet powerful force, leaving a lasting impression on the audience.


